BIOME	LOCATIONS	PHYSICAL FEATURES
tundra	Arctic Northern Alaska Greenland	• flat or gently sloping • cold (permanently frozen permafrost) and dark • short or no trees
boreal forest	Northern Northwest Northwest Europe	• 4000-year-old growing season • very moister, shallow soils and relatively dry in very wet
temperate deciduous forest	Canada United States Western Asia Western Europe	• moderate climate • "four distinct seasons" • 1500-year growing season • enriched soil
temperate rainforest	Coast of China Northwest United States Western Europe	• warm, moist climate • influenced by oceanic winds • dense canopy of moisture loving plants

BIOME	LOCATIONS	PHYSICAL FEATURES
temperate coniferous forest	Western North America Russia Australia	• 4000-year growing season • strong winds • precipitation limited by dry winds
temperate rainforest	around the equator Central America Western Africa Brazil Australia	• ever wet • high, steep • forest floor due to canopy
desert (hot and cold)	every continent	• hot desert • very little rainfall or a lot in very short time period • low and hard soil • very little vegetation
permanent icecap and glacier	Arctic Antarctica Greenland and Antarctica	• strong winds • little rain • little fresh water • very cold year round
